I. LOCKER ROOM

- A. Locker Assignments
 - 1. All Association members may request a locker in the Ladies' Locker Room.
- B. Golf Club Storage
 - 1. No clubs are to be stored in the lockers.

II. GOLF COURSE DRESS CODE

A. Attire

- 1. Tailored slacks, skirts, skorts or shorts are allowed. All skirts, skorts or shorts should be no shorter than 6" above the center of the knee.
- 2. Women should wear golf tops with either a collar and no sleeves or sleeves and no collar designed for golf. Tops with a mock neck, a turtleneck or jewel neckline are acceptable.
- 3. Types of attire <u>not permitted</u> on the course:
 - o Leggings, yoga pants
 - o Tank tops, mid drift, halter-tops, or tee shirts
 - o Denim is not permitted during any golf activity
 - o Jogging or Warm-Up Suits

B. Golf Shoes

1. Spikeless or soft-spiked golf shoes shall be worn on the golf course.

III. GOLF CODE OF CONDUCT

A. Know the Rules of Golf

- 1. Always fix ball marks on greens and divots in fairways.
- 2. Rake bunkers after hitting the ball, subsequently placing, and leaving the rake outside of the bunker.
- 3. Stay on cart paths or fairways whenever possible. Utilize the ingress and egress markers. Carts are not to be driven down hills or up hills on fairways, such as #5, #17, and #18.
- 4. There is a 3-minute limit when searching for lost balls.
- 5. The group playing on their fairway has the right-of-way over a golfer from an adjacent fairway.
- 6. Our fairways are close together. Always yell "fore" if your ball will not land in your fairway.

B. Pull Carts

- 1. Never walk your pull cart over the tee or green.
- 2. When parking your cart to go to the green, try to utilize the same area used by electric carts.
- 3. Stay at least 30 feet away from the greens whenever possible. Extra caution is needed on holes 6, 7, 12 and 15 to stay on the cart paths or below the hill leading to the green. Take care around the hazards and bunkers.
- 4. Occasionally the course is too wet to use pull carts on the course and the pull carts must be restricted to the cart paths.
- 5. All pull carts must be taken home; no storage is provided at the Club.

C. Pace of Play

- 1. All players should be prepared to tee off 10 minutes prior to starting time.
- 2. All players should notify the Pro Shop if unable to make starting time/or play.
- 3. Play ready golf and share the driving.
- 4. Take a choice of clubs, go to your ball and be ready to hit when it is your turn.
- 5. On the green, hole out when possible.
- 6. Invite faster players to play through when there is an open hole.
- 7. Clear the green. Mark scores on the next tee.

8. Keep up with the foursome in front of you.

IV. TUESDAY AND TOURNAMENT GOLF

- 1. Eligible tournament members include WHCC full members, spouses of members as well as daughters of WHCC members who are between the ages of 18 and 26. All eligible tournament members are entitled to play in the weekly games and official tournaments including the three (3) majors if they have paid both the association and tournament dues.
- 2. The Club Championship requires players to have an SCGA handicap based on a minimum of 12 Tuesday rounds played at WHCC within the previous 12 months.
- 3. Dues paying tournament members may sign up at any time for the next Tuesday.
- 4. Non-Tournament members may sign up before or after the field for the following week. If tournament members play with non-tournament players, the tournament players are not eligible to participate in the weekly game.
- 5. Tournament players may play from the red or gold tees. If a player elects to play from the gold tees, their index must be 28.6 or higher in order to be eligible for the Tuesday sweeps.
- 6. All questions (formerly referred to as disputes) must be settled prior to verification of the scorecard. If you have any questions in stroke play, play 2 balls. Report the facts to a member of the designated Rules Committee and/or

Committee member(s) and/or designated Referee will be identified for each tournament.

- 7. Incomplete cards will be disqualified in tournament competition. Those lacking full names, handicaps, date-of-play or scoring and attesting signatures are deemed to be incomplete score cards.
- 8. Each week, both a handicap card and the weekly game card must be completed. All scorecards must be placed in the handicap box within one-half hour of completion of golf round and no later than 2:30 p.m.

V. TEAM PLAY

- 1. Team play shall be in accordance with SCGA Team Rules.
- 2. Team player eligibility shall be in accordance with SCGA Team Rules.
- 3. The Team Roster must be made up of WGA members. After completion of team play, team members shall elect a team captain for the following year.

VI. DUES AND OTHER FEES

A. WHCC WGA Dues

1. Association and tournament dues shall appear on the November billing.

B. SCGA Fees

1. Handicap and SCGA fees will appear on the April billing.
